Japanese Beetles



There has been a dramatic increase in the Japanese Beetle population. They hatch around July 1st and do devasting damage to certain trees and shrubs. They hatch over a 6 week period and live over 60 days. As the adult females die off they lay eggs in our lawn. Grubs soon hatch and feed on your lawns roots. As fall approaches the grubs tunnel into the soil where they remain dormant until they hatch the following July. They emerge again as adult beetles and repeat the cycle.



Japanese beetles devastated this linden tree.



Trees and shrubs exposed to this insect become severely stressed as too much of their leaf tissue is missing to absorb summer sunlight. The crucial process of photosynthesis does not occur.
